Earthcare for Friends: A Study Guide for Individuals and Faith Communities edited by Louis Cox, Ingrid Fabianson, Sandra Moon Farley, Ruah Swennerfelt (Quaker Earthcare Witness, 2004). Quaker Earthcare Witness is calling all Friends to witness for an earth restored, in the same way John Woolman called the Religious Society of Friends to witness against slavery 200 years ago. This study guide contains 18 units that are full of informative articles, discussion questions, activities, demonstrations, tips, prayers, hymns. It also contains 7 brochures suitable for outreach purposes. (254 pages, \$28.80)

Quaker Faith & Practice in Aotearoa New Zealand by the Yearly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers) of Aotearoa New Zealand Te Hāhi Tūhauwiri (2003). This book offers glimpses into the lives, experiences and understandings of Quakers in Aotearoa New Zealand since the arrival of the first Friends on these shores in 1835. (177 pages, \$20.00)

My American Eden: Mary Dyer, Martyr for Freedom by Elizabeth S. Brinton (Burd Street Press, 2003). Mary Dyer emigrated to America in search of freedom, but was persecuted and executed because of her Quaker faith. Her death and that of other religious martyrs strengthened the push for freedom of religious expression, culminating in the Bill of Rights, which separated the law and the church. (250 pages, \$23.85)

Spirited Living: Waging Conflict, Building Peace by Simon Fisher (Quaker Books, Swarthmore Lecture, 2004). The Swarthmore lectureship, established in 1907, provides “an annual lecture on some subject relating to the message and work of the Society of Friends.” In this lecture, Simon Fisher brings fresh and creative ideas to peace building, in view of the fear, violence and the abuse of power that are so prevalent in today’s globalised world. (123 pages, \$22.50)

Trespass and Trust: Quaker Meetings and Sex Offenders by Daphne Glazer (Quaker Books, 2004). The author deliberates about issues around sexual abuse and the lives involved, and discusses the questions of how to maintain trust and safety; how to forgive; how to help an abuser to change; and how we support a Quaker meeting that faces these challenges. (95 pages, \$17.50) ♡
